Susan Alexander manages the Lamoille Regional Solid Waste District; a 12-town consortium with a population of 28,000 located in northern Vermont. The region is defined by a tourist/transient economy including 2 large ski areas (Stowe and Smuggler's Notch), 2 small colleges (Sterling and Northern Vermont University). The LRSWMD operates 5 drop-off locations collecting over 2 dozen materials for recycling and providing convenient and cost-effective waste disposal for residents. In response to the first-in-the-nation food scrap landfill ban Alexander proposed and built a 6-ton per week ASP composting facility. Dubbed Lamoille Soil, the facility received the Jim Marvin Award for Project Design. Coming full circle, Alexander also serves on the Board of Directors for the Washington Electric Coop which owns the generation plant at the Coventry Landfill. She also serves as the Treasurer for the Vermont Solid Waste Management Association and previously served on the Board for the Central Vermont Solid Waste District. Alexander graduated from Cornell University and has focused her career working in the solid waste and environmental management space. She is the principal of Mullandmor, LLC providing environmental management consulting services and the founder and previous owner of the Vermont Switchel beverage company.
